CITY CODE CHANGES FOR ALLEYS


The city council recently voted to make it illegal for people to use the alleys as thoroughfares. This gives the police a new tool to help stop the random people that we see wandering or driving through our alleys. They also made it illegal to lie or sit in a public right-of-way such as a sidewalk.

NEIGHBORHOOD GRANT ROUNDABOUTS UPDATE

Since receiving the grant award last fall, neighbors **Maria Salenger** and **Dan Childers** have been working with Julian Dresang of the City of Tempe to submit plans for the landscaped roundabouts at the intersections of Hudson and Oak and Hudson and Elm. Following several coordination meetings, they were able to submit for site plan review on January 27. Julian expects we'll get comments back (if any) within a week or two, after which he will coordinate construction of the circles through Tempe's concrete subcontractor. Once they complete the work, Maria and Dan will coordinate installation of the landscaping and minor city mandated traffic signage.

FLOOD IRRIGATION PAYS

The city recently completed a study that showed if you only use potable water (tap water) for indoor and land-scaping the average annual water bill cost would be \$938. A similar property using flood irrigation to water their property has an average annual cost of only \$573. If you are a self irrigator your bill is hundreds less than that.

Another way to look at it is by water conservation. The house that only uses tap water uses 298,000 gallons of water a year. The flood irrigated property only uses 58,000 gallons a year.

You would be foolish not to take advantage of flood irrigation if you live in this neighborhood and don't have desert landscaping.
