THE MOTLEY APARTMENTS MOVING FORWARD

As you have noticed the old motel and apartments are being torn down just west of our neighborhood. Lennar Multifamily Communities has started construction on the luxury mixed-use apartment community at the site of the former Days Inn and Sonoran Ridge Apartments. The total construction period for the project is approximately 27 months.

Lennar has informed the Association that they also came to an agreement with the property owner next to them to level the old car wash, Elks lodge and commercial building and use that as their staging area so all traffic should go in and out of Terrace on to Apache and shouldn't impact our neighborhood. This is also good news because squatters at one time or another were using all those buildings.

Since getting approval from the city they changed the name from The Hayden at Dorsey Station to The Motley.

After demolition is completed in October they will be opening in five phases starting in April 2017 with the last building completed by Nov. 2017.

YOUR THOUGHTS ON A NARROWER APACHE BLVD.

In part, because of the feedback on what neighbors want on Apache at the Character Area meetings, the idea was floated at a recent CVAC meeting (Citizens for a Vibrant Apache Corridor) that maybe Apache Boulevard needs to be reduced down to one lane in each direction. Due to the light rail and a change in the way people travel, traffic counts have shown a decline in traffic to about 13,000 cars per day, it used to be over 20,000.

With a narrower street we could widen the sidewalks and provide a more pedestrian experience, add trees, safer bike lanes, maybe have on-street parking for the stores. It would bring the two sides of Apache closer and more intimate. It would open up a whole new realm of possibilities on what Apache could become.

I want to be clear that there are currently no plans to put Apache on a lane diet. I would just like to hear your thoughts on this visionary idea. Please email Phil Amorosi at philamo@cox.net. Thanks.
